

About us

Libraries are so much more than books. They are a place to enjoy and spend time, to work and do research, and to explore all the information and materials offered to you, whether you are a community member, library card holder, or visitor.

Established in 1909, the Johnson County Library operates an 18,500 square foot facility in Buffalo and a 2,000 square foot branch in Kaycee. Our combined collections total 53,000 items. The Carnegie library across Fort Street from the current building at 171 North Adams Avenue was our first home. This building now houses the Jim Gatchell Memorial Museum. A new 8,500 square foot library building was constructed in 1988, opening for public use in 1989. A 2008 needs assessment bolstered the goal of expanding and modernizing that facility, and in 2014, the Johnson County community supported a specific purpose 1 percent tax to fund the bulk of the construction. The \$4.6 million project was completed in early summer of 2016, adding 10,000 square feet and doubling parking capacity.

The branch library in Kaycee was originally the Kaycee Community Library which began in 1951 and was located in the City Hall building, a log cabin structure dating back to the 1890's. The log cabin is now the school house at the Hoofprints of the Past Museum. The library became a branch of the Johnson County Library in 1952. In 1968 the present library building was built and in 1985 an addition was added. The Kaycee Branch Library serves 750+ residents in southern Johnson County.

Every year, tens of thousands of people from Wyoming and all across the United States visit and use the Johnson County Libraries. Hundreds of local children participate in summer reading during June and July, and our annual fundraising gala auction in November has been a local tradition for decades.

The libraries have a dedicated staff who welcome questions and look forward to helping you.

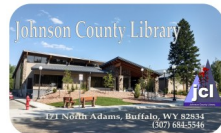

How do I get a library card?

Adults 18 or older simply need to provide a piece of postmarked mail from your home address and a valid photo ID. Children can get their own card too! They must be accompanied by a parent or guardian, who also need to have an active library card. As a library card holder you will have access to all library materials and services. These are shared resources so by signing up for a library card, you agree to obey all the rules and regulations of the public library, to pay promptly all fines and charges for the damage or loss of books, and to give immediate notice of any change of address. The parent or guardian signing a child's card is responsible for any lost or damaged materials.



DONATIONS

The Johnson County Library Foundation is grateful for monetary donations to help support the Johnson County Library and Kaycee Branch Library needs. Ask for information on how you can support your libraries! Books and other material donations are vital to enhancing the libraries collection. We love to receive books that you have enjoyed, so they can be read and enjoyed by others. We will check each donation to see if it can be used in our collection. Those that are not will be set aside for the book sales which provide funding for library programming costs. The Friends of the Library organize and operate the book sales at the Johnson County Library and the Kaycee Branch Library staff do the same for their book sales.

Items we are unable to accept:
Water-stained, mildewed or soiled books. We also ask that you not bring in bags or boxes of what we call 'barn books' which contain dead insects, critter droppings, animal hair, etc. We are unable to safely use these materials. Outdated materials such as encyclopedia sets, medical books older than 5 years, textbooks, VHS tapes, and cassette tapes are also not accepted. We appreciate your understanding. Please bring donations during library business hours. For larger donations please call the library in advance to schedule a time for staff to receive your items.

Oops! They’re OVERDUE - Your books can be renewed once with no penalty. The Johnson County Library system does not charge overdue fines. DVDs and New Fiction tend not to be renewed so that they may circulate to others waiting, though exceptions can be made.

HOLDS - Is there an item you would like but it is currently checked out? Log in to your WYLDcat account to place a hold, and when it becomes available we will give you a call. You can always stop in or call the library and request assistance in placing a hold.

INTERLIBRARY LOANS - The libraries are only so big and cannot possibly house every book. If we don’t have it, we would be happy to borrow the item from another Wyoming library for you. This service takes one to two weeks on average. Donations are always appreciated to assist with the postage for this service and will greatly help your library. We ask that only one item be requested at a time, though exceptions can be made. You can request a book through WYLDcat, or call or stop in at your library and we would be happy to help you.

Did you know? All 23 county library systems in Wyoming operate on a shared catalog - for example, if you’re in Sheridan*, Gillette*, or Casper*, you can check out from their library using your Johnson County Library or Kaycee Branch Library card.

*It is important to note that other libraries have different checkout lengths of time and different overdue fine policies. Please check with the library you are visiting regarding their policies.

Statewide Databases GOWYLD.net: Your library card gives you access to dozens of topics through GOWYLD.net, a statewide information resource that includes help in fields such as arts and humanities, auto repair and DIY, business, current events, encyclopedias, health and medicine, Wyoming history, family history*, job and career support, language learning, law, recommended reading, test and skills preparation, and so much more!

Services

PUBLIC ACCESS COMPUTERS

- Johnson County Library:** 6 desktop computers are available for your use. Enter your 14-digit library card number on the startup screen and click the green “log in” button. Our Cybrarian time management system limits computer use to 1 hour per day. Staff may grant additional time for education, employment, or government forms. Please request additional time before your current time expires. Documents can be printed in black and white or color.
- Kaycee Branch Library:** 3 desktop computers and 2 laptops are available for public use. Documents can be printed in black and white or color.

PRINTING

- Johnson County Library:** Wireless printing is available in the lobby check out our website at www.jclwyo.org under “Services” to print wirelessly through the available link. All print and copy charges are the same across platforms.
 - B&W: \$0.20 per side (8.5” x 11” and 8.5” x 14”)
 - Color: \$0.50 per side (8.5” x 11” and 8.5” x 14”)
 - Large B&W: \$0.50 per side (11” x 17”)
 - Large Color: \$1.00 per side (11” x 17”)
- Kaycee Branch Library:**
 - B&W: \$0.20 per side (8.5” x 11” and 8.5” x 14”)
 - Color: \$0.75 per side (8.5” x 11” and 8.5” x 14”)

SCANNING: This is a free service and available for documents up to 8.5” x 14”.

FAXING: Library staff are happy to send a fax for you. The cost is \$2 for the first page plus \$.50 for each additional page; cover sheet available upon request.

TECHNOLOGY HELP: We are happy to assist you with your basic technology related questions. Appointments may be made in advance so that we can better serve your needs.

STUDY ROOMS at the Johnson County Library: Three study rooms labeled A, B, and C are available on a first come, first served basis. Rooms A and B seat two to four people; Room C can accommodate six comfortably. These rooms can be reserved for a single use by calling the library. Time in each is limited to 3 hours to ensure availability to all; however, that may be extended by staff if there is no one waiting to use the room.

MEETING ROOMS: *Nonprofit, cultural, educational, charitable, civic, family and community gatherings which are not commercial in nature are welcome to use the libraries meeting spaces.*

Johnson County Library: These rooms are available both during and outside of library hours. Both rooms have enough tables and chairs to accommodate meetings and events of various sizes.

- Twing Meeting Room** - 1,300 sq ft with full-size refrigerator, microwave, and sink; seats 60+ at tables and 80+ without. *Fee: \$25 for up to 4 hours, \$50 for more than 4 hours.
- Fraley Meeting Room** - 750 sq ft with mini refrigerator, microwave and small sink; seats 20+ at tables and 40+ without. *Fee: \$15 up to 4 hours, \$25 for more than 4 hours.

*Don’t forget to include time you may need to setup and cleanup.

Kaycee Branch Library: This room is available both during and outside of library hours. Furnished with a large conference table, chairs, microwave and accessibility to a utility sink.

Fee: \$10 for up to 4 hours, \$20 for more than 4 hours.

Departments at the Johnson County Library

CHILDREN’S DEPARTMENT

- An assortment of books at different reading levels for our youngest library patrons - picture books, easy readers, big books, early chapter books, chapter books, graphic novels, nonfiction, audiobook CDs, as well as DVDs, STEAM kits, buddy backpacks, and puppet pals.
- There are two areas within the Children’s department. The preschool area has games, DUPLOs, puzzles, and a puppet stage. The Kindergarten through grade 5 area offers games, LEGOs, and a reading loft. There are also 2 computers for use with your library card and completed parent permission form. Crawl through the orange tunnels and return your books in the handmade and hand painted book drop. Spend your time reading or visiting in this inviting space.

TEEN DEPARTMENT

- Young Adult (YA) books including new and popular authors, graphic novels, and audiobook CDs, Nintendo Switch games, and mini game consoles.
- An assortment of boardgames are ready to play with friends in the Teen Department, as well as 4 computers for use with your library card and completed parent permission form.

The TEEN area is a space for teens only (family excepted, of course.). Children and Adults are asked to use their areas of the library.

LOCAL HISTORY DEPARTMENT-by appointment (M - W)

The local history room is full of donated photographs, recorded histories, family documents, historical newspapers, Johnson County’s high school yearbooks, many rare books, and numerous other items. The best way for us to make time for your research is to schedule an appointment in advance. Our staff is also happy to take your research request over the phone or in person and the history librarian will reply to your request as soon as possible.

The Kaycee Branch Library also offers a collection of Kaycee School yearbooks and other local history resources.
